OPENING DISCUSSION _____

2. Bryan talked about how our culture gives a false view of sex and relationships. As you consider what the world has to offer, what are some common misconceptions about love and sex that the world promotes? **(Romans 12:2)**

BIBLICAL REFLECTION _____

1. In **Song of Solomon 3**, Beloved is deeply in love but also anxious about her future marriage. If you are married or considering marriage, what are some fears you currently feel or felt at the time of your marriage?

What are some common fears or concerns people have about relationships today?

2. **Song of Solomon 3:5** says, "Do not arouse or awaken love until it so desires." What does this mean, and how does it apply to modern dating and relationships?

3. In **Song of Solomon 4:12**, Solomon describes his bride as a "private garden," symbolizing commitment, trust, and the sacred nature of their intimacy. Read the following passages and reflect on the question below:

- **Genesis 39:6-12**

- **1 Corinthians 6:18-20**

What do we learn from these verses? Why is doing what they say so difficult in a culture that is so flooded with distorting what God says should be good?
